

## Voice Command, Flash Purchase with another currency

I'm in England on a business trip and I've changed my default transaction currency to Euros. I also prepared a voice command of "MAX10EURO" which prepares a QR-c for any merchant not to exceed 10 units of Code-S=E for Euro.

I'm suffering from jet lag and need some caffeine and sugar before my meeting. I step into the nearest restaurant that uses NC3. I don't know what I want; don't see any placards, and I'm in a hurry. Like Aladdin I pronounce "MaxTenEuro" and my QR-c is prepared.

A few more moments and I am in front of the scanner. The cashier is a step further down the line. I place my device so the scanner can read it. The scanner does and the green LED blinks indicating a good scan. Because the actual amount hasn't been set the merchant's system does not yet communicate my charge authorization to the provider.
